Questions relating to the Denunciation of Conventions

56. The Governing Body -

- (a) endorsed the general principle that, in any case in which the denunciation of a ratified international labour Convention might be contemplated, it was desirable for the government concerned, before taking a decision on the matter, fully to consult the representative organisations of employers and workers on the problems encountered and the measures to be taken to resolve them;
- (b) requested the Director-General, in any case in which he became aware that the denunciation of an international labour Convention was contemplated, to draw the attention of the government concerned to the above-mentioned principle endorsed by the Governing Body;
- (c) requested the Director-General, in any case in which a government communicated to him the denunciation of an international labour Convention without an indication of the reasons which had led to its decision, to request the government concerned to provide such indications, for the information of the Governing Body.
